3. Certificate of Independent Bid Determination (SBD 9)

- 3.1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 3.2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- 3.3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:

4 REQUEST FOR QUOTATION: PREFERRED SUPPLIER FOR LEGAL ADVISOR ON INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

The South African National Space Agency (SANSA) requires a **Legal Advisor on Industrial** relations to be appointed as a preferred supplier until 31 March 2023 for the SANSA Hermanus Facility located in Hermanus, Western Cape

4.1 BACKGROUND TO SANSA

The South African National Space Agency (SANSA) has a mandate, as outlined in the South African National Space Agency Act, 2008 (Act No 36 of 2008), to co-ordinate and integrate national space science and technology programmes and conduct long-term planning and implementation of space-related activities in South Africa, for the benefit of the citizens of South Africa

4.2 SCOPE OF WORK (TERMS OF REFERENCE)

SANSA requires a labour lawyer (legal advisor on Industrial Relations) to be appointed on a consultancy basis to assist the SANSA Hermanus branch with Industrial Relations situations as detailed in the scope of services below.

Scope of Services - Industrial Relations

- Assisting with or chairing disciplinary and grievance hearings.
- Facilitating poor performance / incapacity counselling meetings
- Assist with revising /drafting and negotiating disciplinary and workplace codes
- Assistance in preparing for / or representation in Mediation and Arbitration proceedings (CCMA), subject to the Rules of the CCMA.
- Guiding employers through organisational restructuring exercises (retrenchments / redundancies / changing conditions of employment) and assisting with / leading the consultation / negotiation processes
- Grievances
- Arbitration
- Workplace Forums/Union involvement

Requirements of service provider:

- Relevant Law Degree
- Must be fully competent in English. Afrikaans and isiXhosa would be an advantage.
- Min 3 -5 Years' experience as a Labour Lawyer
- CCMA experience as representative of organisation
- Must have a valid SA Driver's license
- Must be located within a 90 minute drive of the SANSA Hermanus Facility and must be willing to visit the SANSA Hermanus campus should the need arise

A service level agreement will be entered into with the successful bidder for services provided on a as and when required basis. A detailed written quotation must be submitted before a service is being rendered and no services shall be rendered unless a purchase order is issued by SANSA.

PLEASE NOTE: Only one service provider will be appointed for the period till March 2023. The service provider will be utilised as and when required, and should understand that the requirements will vary throughout the contract period depending on the need. The contact person for SANSA will be the Human Resources Manager based in Hermanus, Western Cape.

5 EVALUATION CRITERIA

SANSA promotes the concept of "best value" in the award of contracts, as opposed to merely looking for the cheapest price, which does not necessarily provide the best value. Best value incorporates the expertise, experience and technical proposal of the organisation and individuals who will be providing the service and the organisational capacity supporting the project team.

SANSA is committed to achieving Government's transformation objectives in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act.

The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R500 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

The procedure for the evaluation of responsive tenders is price, functionality (quality) and preference method. The evaluation of the bids will be conducted in the following two stages:

- Firstly, the assessment of quality will be done in terms of the evaluation criteria (Table 1) and the minimum threshold of 80 points explained below. A bid will be disqualified if it fails to meet the minimum threshold for functionality as per the bid invitation
- Thereafter, only the qualifying bids are evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference points systems, where the 80 points will be used for price and the 20 points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contributor in accordance with the Table below
