### 3. Certificate of Independent Bid Determination (SBD 9)

3.1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids<sup>1</sup> invited.

3.2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).<sup>2</sup> Collusive bidding is a pe se prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

3.3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:

- a. disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors have abused the institution's supply chain management system and or committed fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.
- b. cancel a contract awarded to a supplier of goods and services if the supplier committed any corrupt or fraudulent act during the bidding process or the execution of that contract.

This SBD serves as a certificate of declaration that would be used by institutions to ensure that, when bids are considered, reasonable steps are taken to prevent any form of bid-rigging.

## **REQUEST FOR QUOTATION FOR A SERVICE PROVIDER TO SUPPLY AND INSTALL A PAIR OF BOOM GATES FOR VEHICLES ENTERING AND EXITING SANSA PREMISES IN HERMANUS**

The South African National Space Agency (SANSA) requires a service provider to supply and install boom gates for incoming and outgoing vehicles at **the SANSA Hermanus division located in Hermanus, Western Cape.**

The South African National Space Agency (SANSA) has a mandate, as outlined in the South African National Space Agency Act, 2008 (Act No 36 of 2008), to co-ordinate and integrate national space science and technology programmes and conduct long-term planning and implementation of space-related activities in South Africa, for the benefit of the citizens of South Africa

### **4.1 SCOPE OF WORK**

SANSA currently has an existing boom gate system, operational by remote and loop functions, but the installation is outdated and needs replacement with additional security features added to the installation.

The current boom gate control system, is in excess of seven (7) years old and operational from an outdated Impro system (Software). We are in the process of upgrading our access control system and the boom gate installation must be compatible with the new chosen software. The objective is for the bidders to provide a detailed design of the installation, specifications of hardware and software, and recommendations to assist SANSA in controlling gate access to the property.

The services rendered must be done in a sustainable cost effective manner whilst minimising downtime and ensuring safety, functionality, effectiveness and compliance to all relevant legislations (such as for electrical installations).

The successful bidder shall provide all necessary equipment, test equipment and labour to perform the required installation, inspection and testing of the new boom gate installation with minimal downtime and disruption to on site activities.

Specifications:

- Boom length 2 x 3m (contractor to confirm size at compulsory site briefing).
- Rust protection must be in place
- Blue-chem treatment application to PC boards – SANSA located close to the coast
- Cabinets to be optimally protected against corrosion – powder coated
- Wired button in guard room.
- Foldable curtain to be confirmed at site briefing.
- The units must accommodate high traffic flow
- Capable of opening and closing safely and quickly
- Swing to 90 degrees up or down within minimum 1.5 seconds
- Primary power supply: Mains
- Secondary power supply: operational with battery backup supply
- Work without battery (when battery is completely removed) on mains power
- In the event of battery and electrical failure, unit must be operational manually – Include arm



- LCD interface, diagnostics and fault finding to be performed on this interface
- Transmitter and Multichannel receiver to be installed for remote control operations
- Remote control enabled
- Spares must be readily available
- 3-year service and maintenance warranty must be provided on the installation

**Please note that this requirement is for the SANSA Hermanus site, and all submitted proposals must take this into account.**

**There will be a compulsory site briefing session on 09 February 2022 11AM at SANSA Hermanus. Bidders who do not attend the site briefing session will be disqualified.**

## **EVALUATION CRITERIA**

SANSA promotes the concept of “best value” in the award of contracts, as opposed to merely looking for the cheapest price, which does not necessarily provide the best value. Best value incorporates the expertise, experience and technical proposal of the organisation and individuals who will be providing the service and the organisational capacity supporting the project team.

SANSA is committed to achieving Government’s transformation objectives in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act.

The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R500 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the **80/20** system shall be applicable.

**Please Note: the above amount (R500 000) is not the Budget Amount for this Project but is the Treasury threshold for request for quotation (RFQ).**

- Only bidders who meet eligibility requirements (Table 2) will be evaluated on quality or functionality.
- The assessment of quality will be done in terms of the evaluation criteria (Table 3) and the minimum threshold of **80** points explained below. A bid will be disqualified if it fails to meet the minimum threshold for functionality as per the bid invitation
- Bids are evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference points systems, where the 80 points will be used for price and the 20 points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contributor in accordance with the Table below
